The Tallac Historic Site and the Taylor Creek Visitor Center believe that this is an opportunity for them to showcase their sites, their exhibits, and their programs to give visiting families wonderful experiences, close to home, either for free or for very reasonable prices.

The Historic Site will continue its many successful programs and tours as well as a new children's puppet theater program that was started last summer, which takes place weekly and includes lots of musical and craft activities. The site tours have been expanded to include a visit to the Vallhalla Grand Hall.

The Visitor Center will be continuing its many successful programs such as the weekly Kids in the Creek and Rainbow Trail Night Walk and its special guest evening programs such as An Evening With Mark Twain, Wild Things, and the ever popular "Bat Lady." It is working hard on plans for the 20th anniversary of the Kokanee Festival with the retirement of Sammy the Salmon and the introduction of Rocky and Sandy Salmon. And two new weekly programs are under development. 
